Spiritual Director Ponderings:

With all this warm weather you'd think it was spring already! It's been a blessing for those who like warm weather, a bane for those who want to be out on the slopes skiing or snowboarding. Either way, it's been out of place with expectations for this time of year – I mean, I was in shorts for three of the last six days!

Things can also get out of place in our lives – caught up in a variety of different distractions like work, family time, recreational pursuits (indoor and outdoor), jobs around the home, and who knows what else. Often we even get out of place in our faith connections – whether it's going to church for worship, or attending a reunion group, or engaging in some kind of spiritual nurture (like Bible Study, devotions, prayer, etc.).

If you read through the Gospels, you find that Jesus could even get into times where he got caught up in things. It's then that he would step back, take a break, and reconnect with his Father in prayer. He did that often. It was a source of strength and guidance for him.
